June 13 - Tour of Parker Farm Nature Restoration (Date change)

Meet at the Parker family farm at 7:00 p.m. at 363341 McBeth Road (west) for an informative walk of their field and trail system, led by Terry Parker. Highlights include bobolink and butterfly viewing opportunities. The Bobolink is considered a "wide ranging species" and in fact, the Bobolink is one of the world's most impressive songbird migrants, travelling approximately 20,000 km to and from South America. Throughout its lifetime, it may travel the equivalent of 4 or 5 times around the circumference of the earth. **NOTE**: In order to see bobolinks, who have arrived early, we've changed the date. Naturalist and fungi expert Inga Hinnerichsen will lead the tour and identify the various fungi at the Lawson Nature Reserve. Fungi are different from animals and plants. A fungus breaks down dead organic matter around it, and uses it as food. For the longest time they were considered plants, but in the late 1960's



they were classified as their own Kingdom. It is estimated that there are over a million species of fungi worldwide. Come see what the Lawson Nature Reserve has to offer from this fascinating world.
