
Trail Map

Tract Rules

- Daytime use only
- Caution:** Stay on the trails – poison ivy lives here
- No motorized vehicles, bicycles or horses allowed
- All pets **MUST** be leashed securely
- Owners must clean up after their pets
- No camping, fires, littering or hunting permitted
- No person shall cut, remove, injure or destroy a plant, tree, shrub, flower or other living thing
- Be respectful of other visitors – stay on trails, control your pet
- Remember – we are all responsible to protect and not disturb wildlife

The Lawson Nature Reserve is situated in the Carolinian Zone, an ecosystem that boasts the greatest variety of wildlife and plant species than any other Canadian ecosystem – an estimated 2200 plant species and almost 400 bird species – more than half of all bird species in Canada. Unfortunately, the Carolinian zone is the most threatened ecosystem in the province.
